Each June, the National Institute of Flamenco and the University of New Mexico host Festival Flamenco Internacional de Alburquerque, bringing the finest flamenco artists in the world to Albuquerque. For seven days, the city is filled with the pulse of flamenco, and is transformed into a cultural epicenter for the art form. This tradition celebrates flamenco, the ancient form of artistic expression of the Spanish-Gypsy culture. The lure of flamenco is its ability to explore the full range of human emotion with an intense, vibrant quality that leaves audiences and students alike, captivated.

flamenco recital, which on one hand didn't want to show completely the visual and narrative universe of the former piece, but on the other hand didn't know how to refuse to the poetical moods that had structured it. Since *Vinática* represented something like the seminal piece where Rocío confronted her own metamorphosis, from *bailaora* to *danzaora*, getting high on childhood in order to assume, by the same act of drunkenness, her right to excess, to instability of existential and artistic maturity, the new *Danzaora y Vinática* looks upon this initiation, this ritual of passage, from a pragmatic and experimental dimension, the true arena of an adult fight against-and besides- of the most severe recital's language, which is the most concrete universe.

COMPAÑÍA ANTONIO MOLINA "EL CHORO": AVISO: BAYLES DE JITANOS

The art of Flamenco is the product of a slow process of musical, cultural, and social alchemy, produced in Andalusian soil. A great and beautiful mosaic formed by infinity of colors, forms, and origins; that we now know thanks to musical, cultural, and social analyses done by researchers and scholars in the Art of Flamenco. History brings us news, data, and surprising proofs, enlightening and inspiring.

That is the starting point for the creation of this abstract production, where there is no intention, party or explanatory position on the motive that inspires or generates it; but rather an exposition of current flamenco music and dance that takes as a foundation, part of the musical and choreographic adapted repertories, adopted or created by the gypsy people from the XVII century until now. Dances, songs, and music with which we do not intend to arrive to a lesson, nor abide to a certain chronology; we also do not intend to stage chapters that are a part of the gypsy people. *Aviso: Bayles de Jitanos* is to dance those Andalusian and gypsy, nongypsy, black, afroamerican, gypsyesque, Moorish, Sephardic, educated, popular, traditional, pre-flamencas, and flamencas music.

COMPAÑÍA JUANA AMAYA: MORÓN BAILA

COMPAÑÍA MANUEL LIÑÁN: NÓMADA

Humans innately, in one way or another, continue to be nomadic; no longer moved solely by the initial demands, searching for physical sustenance, but also attending other necessities, just as important, such as emotional needs. For this show, Manuel Liñán proposes a format composed of three *bailaoras*, three *bailaores*, three voices, and two guitars; with the idea of building a show format to develop his work as a choreographer, director, and dancer. Different worlds that feed the author, sometimes as a choreographer, exposing his queries from an exterior prism, and other times as a dancer himself, representing these queries. These two different paths allow him to survive emotionally in constant exploration.

Nómada is a collective journey sometimes found in different geographic regions that frame flamenco in different textures. The *cante*, dance, and guitar, located in different areas, provide to the art a plurality of concepts and styles that enrich it, manifesting itself in different forms.
