

# Camino de Santiago Film Festival 2018



The first edition of this film festival seeks to promote the Camino de Santiago through cinema and audiovisual installations.

The Camino de Santiago Film Festival is an intercultural festival that opens the door to the regions of the Camino culture and the world of cinema. The Festival facilitates the exchange of ideas through stories of cultural and social relevance, and creates a suitable space for the general public, pilgrims, and film professionals. It also promotes joint efforts of filmmakers and strengthens the links between the film industry of Spain and Portugal, and the United States of America.

Running October 12-14, the first edition of the Camino de Santiago Film Festival (Boston 2018) features 10 films with more than 20 screenings at the Cambridge Public Library, Real Colegio Complutense at Harvard University, and The Instituto Cervantes Observatory of the Spanish Language and Hispanic Cultures in the United States.
