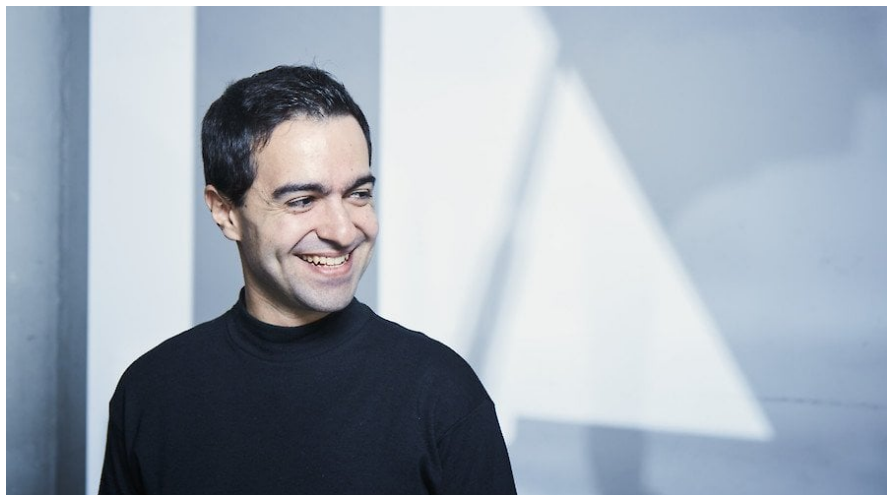




José Menor in concert in Los Angeles

repertoire, and a sought-after performer of new music. His performance of *Goyescas* by Granados was declared “magnificent” by Martha Argerich, and was released in July 2017 on the IBS Classical label.

2016 saw him on a worldwide tour to commemorate Granados’ 100th anniversary, with performances at Carnegie Hall, Meet in Beijing’ Arts Festival in China, the Progetto Martha Argerich in Switzerland and St John’s Smith Square in London amongst many others. He was also the Resident Pianist in Granados’ birthplace (Lleida), where he performed most of his solo and chamber works.

Menor is established as a prime interpreter of contemporary piano. His debut with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra (RPO) in London performing Albéniz’s *Concierto Fantástico* was highly acclaimed by the international press and launched a series of performance premieres. As a concerto soloist, he has appeared with orchestras including the Wuhan Philharmonic (China); Montevideo Philharmonic (Uruguay); Redlands Symphony Orchestra (USA); Wrocław and Bydgoszcz Philharmonics (Poland); Sinfónica de Xalapa (México); and major orchestras in Spain including RTVE, OBC, Simfònica del Vallès, JONDE and JONC. As a chamber musician, he has collaborated with numerous artists, including Philip Setzer (Emerson Quartet), Ransom Wilson and Alexander Sitkovetsky. His performances have been broadcast worldwide.

As a composer himself, his output includes orchestral works, chamber music, songs and piano music. In 2017, Menor was commissioned by the Centro Nacional de Difusión Musical to compose and premiere a *piano étude*, *New Crossroads*, and then performed it in a live broadcast on Spanish national radio. Forthcoming engagements include Messiaen’s *Vingt Regards* at the Festival de Arte Sacro in Madrid; an appearance in the Orchestre Nationale de Lille 2018 concert season; *Goyescas* at Klassik Festival Momentum in Germany; and the premiere of Hèctor Parra’s *piano concerto* in 2019. Further recording projects include the complete works by Parra (Aparté label, France), among others.

ABOUT JACARANDA

Jacaranda is a series of intimate concert adventures into the realm of new and rarely-heard classical music designed to awaken curiosity, passion and discovery. Based in Santa Monica since 2003, Jacaranda was immediately hailed by *LA Weekly* as “the right music in the right place at the right time.” More than a decade later, *LA Weekly* named Jacaranda Best Contemporary Classical Series in 2016: “Wonderfully un-stodgy curation by Jacaranda founders Patrick Scott and Mark Alan Hilt and performances by acclaimed and expert musicians make for ear-cleansing dives into bracingly new music composed largely by living composers, as well as unplayed-to-death music of the past century.”
