

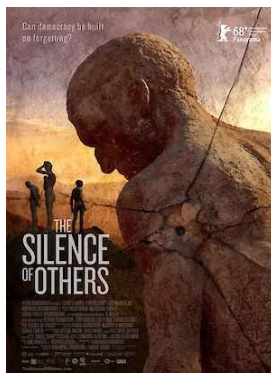


The Silence of Others at 2018 LA Film Festival
