MARTA BARRIO

Marta Barrio, a Spanish author and editor born in New Haven in 1986, gained recognition with her debut novel *The Wild Cats of Kerguelen* (2020) in the crime genre, and was praised by critics, who celebrated her ability to perturb with the story and atmosphere.

Her second book, *Leña menuda* (2021), made her the youngest winner of the Tusquets Prize. Her third novel, *No volverán tus ojos a mirarme*, delves into the protagonist's childhood.

For a decade she has also been an editor at Alianza Editorial, where she is in charge of the Alianza Literaturas collection.
