

Cartas de amor a Stalin



A theatrical production directed by Pietro González and presented as part of Cervantes in live: Sceene without limits.

On 18 April 1930, Russian writer Mikhail Bulgakov received a personal phone call from Stalin. The two men talked about the censorship of Bulgakov's work, but ultimately nothing was resolved. Cartas de amor a Stalin (Love Letters to Stalin) imagines the devastating effects of that phone call on the writer, as it explores the complex relationship between power and art.
