- Screening: Narraciones: Spanish fashion films.

- A visual journey through some of the most relevant works produced in Spain, in relation to fashion film, including excerpts from documentaries and newsreels, as well as selections from the 1960s avant-garde known as the Barcelona School. Presenting films by Eugenio Recuenco, Daniel Riera, Gorka and Diego Postigo and Josep Maria Ferrater. This documentary is curated by Charo Mora, who will moderate the Q&A after the screening.
