Tomás Luis de Victoria, is considered to be one of Spain's most prolific and impactful composers during Spain's "Golden Age" at the height of the Renaissance. His composition of the *Lamentations of Jeremiah* is considered to be one of his most profound works –composing on the musings of the prophet Jeremiah during for the Triduum leading up to Easter Sunday.
