


A Mirror of the Cosmos

A Mirror of the Cosmos explores how the Mar Menor lagoon, considered a paradise in southeastern Spain, is being pushed to the brink of extinction by the climate crisis. Opening with a conversation between the moon and the sea, the documentary explores how the unlikely relationships between invasive blue crabs, nitrates, and mining deposits in Mar Menor deeply intertwine to tell a larger story of capitalism's extractive, cumulative effects on the environment over time.

Presented in conjunction with the *Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital (DCEFF)*, this event event is part of the ongoing film series *Art Films and Special Screenings* organized by the National Gallery of Art.
