

AFI Latin American Film Festival



Now in its 24th year, the AFI Latin American Film Festival showcases the best filmmaking from Latin America and, with the inclusion of films from Spain and Portugal, celebrates Ibero-American cultural connections.

Highlights this year include: Argentina's Thesis on a Homicide (Tesis sobre un homicidio), starring Ricardo Darín; Bless Me, Última, the screen adaptation of Rudolfo Anaya's landmark Chicano novel; Viola, an Argentine spin on Shakespeare's Twelfth Night; Sugar Kisses (Besos de azucar), written and directed by Mexico's Carlos Cuarón (Rudo y Cursi); The Future (Il futuro), Chilean filmmaker Alicia Scherson's adaptation of a novel by celebrated author Roberto Bolaño, set in Rome and starring Rutger Hauer; A Gun in Each Hand (Una pistola en cada mano), Spanish filmmaker Cesc Gay's battle-of-the-sexes farce, starring Javier Camara, Eduardo Noriega and Ricardo Darín; So Much Water (Tanta Agua), a multi-award-winning coming-of-age tale from Uruguay; Viramundo, a documentary about Brazilian musical star-turned-Ministry of Culture Gilberto Gil; The Dead Man and Being Happy (El Muerto y Ser Feliz), an oddball road movie across the Argentine countryside, directed by Spaniard Javier Rebollo; and Rio 2096: A Story of Love and Fury (Uma história de amor e fúria), a visionary animated film, awarded the top prize at this year's Annecy Animated Film Festival
