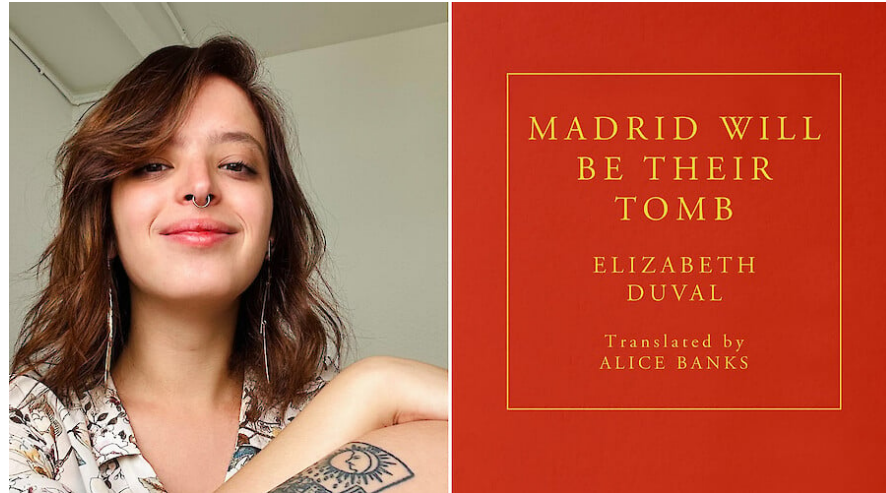




Elizabeth Duval at Alexandria's Old Town Books

Graduated in Philosophy and French Language and Literature, Duval is a regular contributor in Spanish media outlets. She writes poetry, prose, theater, and essay and explores the intersection between text and audiovisual media. She has written *Reina*, the first memoir in Spain by a woman from Generation Z, as well as *Exception*, a long poem about the streets on fire. In 2021 she published the essay *After The Trans*, and the novel *Madrid Will Be Their Tomb* that was praised by critics and readers alike.

In 2023 she published a sociopolitical essay on how to recover hope when facing a grim future and *Poserótica*, a reflection on intimacy through poetry.
