In this Open Doors weekend, you will have the chance to visit the latest art installations, both outside and within the walls of the cultural center, including the upcoming new exhibition *History of Hispanism: Spain and Beyond*.

## INDOORS EXHIBITS

- *History of Hispanism: Spain and Beyond*. Curated by Richard Kagan, one of the most acclaimed experts on the topic of our century, this exhibition explores the meaning of “Hispanism” as a concept applied to different areas and its evolution.
- *Ramón y Cajal by Brais Rodríguez*. As part of the sixth edition of *Not Your Regular Wall*, Spanish artist Brais Rodríguez imprinted the walls of the Former Residence of the Ambassadors of Spain in Washington, D.C. with his artistic proposal Ramón y Cajal in celebration of the 170th anniversary of the Spanish scientist’s birth.

## OUTDOORS EXHIBITS

- *DC.es: Outdoors*. showcases works by five Spanish artists on their perspectives of the world’s political capital on the outdoor fence of the Cultural Center.
- *Around Blooming, Around Reforesting by Doa Oa*, a work that creates a deep and empathetic connection with flowers and nature, promoting the appreciation of their beauty, awareness of plant diversity, and the historical relationship between humans and plants through pictorial interventions and reforestation projects.
- *SPAINfographics design*. To showcase individually the infographic



designs of *SPAINographics*, all the proposals are displayed monthly in the front garden of the Spanish Cultural Center.

- *La Mujer del Alfeizar* by *Carmen Segovia*. Spanish illustrator Carmen Segovia explores the idea of returning to the outside world in this third intervention on the windows of the Spanish Cultural Center.
