



Iberian Suite – Teatro de La Abadía: Entremeses



One of Spain's most acclaimed theater companies makes its U.S. debut with a revival of *Entremeses*, featuring three comedic one-acts by *Don Quixote* author Miguel de Cervantes.

Founded in 1995, Madrid's Teatro de La Abadía makes its United States debut with a revival of *Entremeses*, one of the company's first productions, directed by José Luis Gómez. An *entremés* is a short, comedic one-act play historically performed as an interlude during a long dramatic work in 16th and 17th-century Spain. This engagement features three entremeses –*El Retablo de las Maravillas*, *La Cueva de Salamanca*, and *El Viejo Celoso*– all written by *Don Quixote* author Miguel de Cervantes.
