As part of the 2023 edition of "Kids Euro Fest," Spain will be present at the Family Day as well as offering a free performance of the play "Picasso" at GALA Hispanic Theater.

From October 21-28, families across the DMV area are invited to participate in the EU's large Family Day event or in a number of independent embassy events across the city. Kids up to 12 can experience the best European performances, crafts, games, and food. Spain has organized two events within this year's edition of *Kids Euro Fest*:

The Cultural Office of the Embassy of Spain will have a stand (table) in which kids will be able to learn about Spain as a country: its history, geography, culture, and even

science. Through different experiments proposed by ECUSA (Spanish Scientists in the USA), kids will explore the different blood types for humans, and their importance in the medical

field. They will experiment what happens when different blood types mix and will be able to figure out the blood type of unknown samples given by the scientists.
