Representing a global array of cultures, Silkroad musicians co-create art, performance, and ideas. The Silk Road Ensemble has been called “vibrant and virtuosic” by the *Wall Street Journal*, “one of the 21st century’s great ensembles” by the *Vancouver Sun*, and a “roving musical laboratory without walls” by the *Boston Globe*.

Made up of performers and composers from more than 20 countries, the Silk Road Ensemble was formed by Yo-Yo Ma in 2000. Since then, audiences and critics in over 30 countries throughout Asia, Europe, and North America have embraced these artists passionate about cross-cultural understanding and innovation. The group has recorded six albums. Their new album, *Sing Me Home*, was released in April 2016. The Music of Strangers: Yo-Yo Ma and the Silk Road Ensemble, a documentary Silkroad musicians directed by Academy Award-winner Morgan Neville (*20 Feet from Stardom*), was released in June 2016.
