This generation of Spanish designers is very heterogeneous; however they share some essential traits:

- They network with the international design community.
- They cover all fine arts and blend disciplines.
- They have a strong environmental awareness.
- Their proposals are humorous and playful.

• Many of their projects are conceptual, pragmatic ideas and critiques, leaving behind the shape and function dichotomy, in order to explore other values in design that are more symbolic.

• But they are also practical, approaching the industry sector by creating mass-produced products that are meant to fulfil new needs.

• They are not interested in being part of an artistically uniform group, nor do they want to create a common style. They do not want to represent Spain or lead a movement. Each designer follows their own rules and looks for their own singularity and individuality.

The most relevant feature of this new generation is the fact that they have no features in common.
It is the first generation of globalization and the Internet

BRAVOS: GROUNDBREAKING SPANISH DESIGN

San Francisco, CA. BRAVOS is an innovative exhibition that portrays an overview of the new Spanish design scene. It comprises the works of twenty-one of the most talented and successful young Spanish designers, and represents the best product design work of the Spanish Design Boom.

The curator Juli Capell, Spanish design expert and architect, has carefully researched and selected the key designers participating. After an important design history with figures such as **Gaudí**, **Dalí**, and 20th century masters as important as **Ricard**, **Milá**, **Tusquets**, and **Mariscal**, Juli Capella now gathers the best and latest talents to emerge in the field of product design in the 21st century.

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Previously shown at Dwell on Design in Los Angeles and the American University Museum Katzen Arts Center in Washington, Bravos will be on exhibition in San Francisco this January at Fort Mason Center before travelling to San Juan of Puerto Rico, Europe and Asia.

Featuring internationally renowned **Jaime Hayon** and **Patricia Urquiola**, experimental and cutting edge designers **Nacho Carbonell** and **Curro Carlet**, and well-established designers **Martin Azua**, **Marti Guixe** and **Antoni Arola**, amongst others, the exhibition introduces us to an array of 21st centaury Spanish *designers*.

'The exhibition is dedicated to the people and not the objects for one obvious reason: design used to be an anonymous discipline in which the most vital element was the final product: today, the constant attention of the media has made the creator the centre of attention.' Juli Capella.

Product design recognises designers when aesthetics takes over functionality. Chairs, lamps and other home ware in the exhibition correspond to these more creative aspects without tumbling over their use value. Large scaled portraits of each designer, captured by the tendentious lens of the photographer Rafael Vargas, depict the conceptual source of the final product.

In cooperation with San Francisco Museum of Modern Art and Architecture and Design Forum, The Consulate General of Spain in San Francisco will host a **Conversation with Nacho Carbonell** in which he will be sharing the process of his work. The Conversation will take place in the South Side Theatre at Fort Mason Center, Landmark Building D., at 6 pm January, Thursday 5th.
