(Arlington, VA) This fall Artisphere, in partnership with SPAIN arts & culture, will present THINK WITH YOUR HANDS: Illustrated Journals Come to Life through Augmented Reality. Think with Your Hands brings together the illustrated journals of Spanish illustrators and graphic designers Pep Carrió and Isidro Ferrer in a unique collaboration between artists and software developers. The exhibit takes an unusual twist where animation, video and augmented reality bring to life over sixty illustrations of two of Spain's most interesting graphic artists working today. This connection between creativity and innovation is central to Artisphere's focus on artists working at the forefront of new technologies.

The illustrated journals, collages and sculptures of award-winning Carrió and Ferrer were used as a platform to explore the development of two and three dimensional animation through augmented reality. UNIT, a team of programmers and artists at the Polytechnic University of Valencia, Spain developed an app for iPads, iPhones and Android mobile devices that responds to the artwork and brings the two dimensional characters to life. This emerging technology is so new that the developers are just beginning to realize the potential of its applications. Of the 150 illustrations on exhibit, over 60 will be app-responsive, allowing the patron to experience two-dimensional artwork in previously unimaginable ways. The illustrations and collages highlight the artists' graphic design style, embracing humor, surrealism and sublime moments of life.

Originating at Universitat Politècnica de València (Polytechnic University of Valencia) the idea of combining art with technology was presented to Carrió and Ferrer. The resulting exhibit went from the Facultat de Belles Arts Exhibition Hall to the Museo ABC Drawing and Illustration Center in Madrid where its enthusiastic reception lead to this tour of the United States, supported by the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport of Spain. The

exhibit will then travel to the Instituto Cervantes Chicago in early 2015.

About Artisphere

Since it opened in 2010 Artisphere has been a home for creative connections between artists and audiences. One of Artisphere's core values is to explore the intersection of art and technology in the presentation and discussion of ideas. *Think With Your Hands* explores how art and technology can merge to create a new way of viewing and thinking about the world around us. Keep a distance of about 6 inches between the paper or object and the lens to be able to discover and interact with the digital contents that appear on your device. You can turn the pages of the interactive sketchbooks sliding your finger over the screen, both ways.

VISUALITY is a concert that incorporates several musical pieces, multimedia and live performances to explore the visual aspects of music. Presented by Cre.Art Project, each piece explores how light and sound can intersect in their purest form. The collective moves into new territory by using mapped video projection to transform the stage into a canvas for a unique experience. The overall work is fluid, with each piece adapting uniquely to the space used, sometimes modifying the works performed, or by producing new creations or incorporating new artists. There are currently are nine works in Visuality's repertoire. Included are compositions by Andre Prévin, Béla Bartók, Marcos Fernandez, Jacob Ter Veldhuis, Donnacha Denny and Frank Martin.

Founded in Spain in 2006 by Guillermo Laporta and Tagore González and joined later by designer David Orrico, Cre.Art Project gathers musicians, visual artists, dancers, actors, writers, designers, and acrobats from all over the world to create original performances. The collective works through multidisciplinary interaction; and has produced shows in Europe and America collaborating on a wide range of projects in music, theatre, dance and visual arts.
